Incorporated in 1979 under the Nigerian Companies Decree of 1968, with 60:40 ratio of foreign to Nigerian Shareholders, Dornier Aviation Nigeria AIEP Limited (DANA) has grown to become Nigeria's leading aeronautical complex. DANA's initial capitalisation of N 50.000 has been increased to N 260 Million in 1997.



In addition to regular and spot charter operations DANA provides maintenance and training services for owners of DORNIER aircraft as well as high quality aircraft service and maintenance support to airlines, charter companies and private aircraft owners in Nigeria and the West-African Subregion. DANA has developed and produced the Air Beetle Ab-initio-Trainer Aircraft and supports the operation, including modifications for the extension of the Training-syllabus.



THE DANA GENERAL AVIATION CENTRE

The headquarters of DANA is located at the Kaduna Old Airport, Nigeria. The facility covers several hectares and the infrastructure consists of three Office building complexes, five hangars, an aircraft production facility, workshops for aircraft and non aircraft related work, stores, a training centre, fire and rescue facility, fuel station and a large apron.



Five hangars of assorted sizes are on the site. One of which houses the Nigerian Air Border Patrol operation, which is based within the DANA complex. The remaining hangars can accept aircraft up to turbo commuter/corporate jet size. All hangars are equipped with power, air and lighting and supported by several dedicated workshops for: avionics, engines, fuel and hydraulic components and batteries. All workshops are equipped for the level of work they are approved to carry out and can offer combined services not obtainable elsewhere in Nigeria.

DANA is an approved Maintenance Organisation with a team of licensed aircraft engineers and technicians capable of offering full aircraft maintenance support on twenty-one (21) different aircraft types, and is the only DORNIER aircraft Service Centre in Africa and one of the three Allied Signal Engines (Garrett) major Service Centres in the Continent.
